Our mission is to inspire, motivate and prepare youth and adults for educational and career advancement, through after-school arts, and job training programs. The Youth department serves youth between 5th & 11 grades for our six week collaborative arts program where we introduce campers to music, dance, art and digital arts culminating in a student showcase for parents and community.

The Fellow would be co-creating and co-developing the curriculum of the summer program under the direction/supervision of the Director. Supervision of youth staff, planning and interaction with the community and families will be an additional part of the role.

The ConnCAT Collaborative Arts Summer Program consists of 50-60 youth who will participate in a six-week program that consists of digital art, dance, music and fine arts. The Fellow will be responsible for the overall supervision of the program and be deeply engaged with the youth. Trip planning and daily outdoor activities will be implemented as well as communicating with families. The outcome expected is to expose the Fellow to the New Haven Community and ConnCAT's culture, forge new relationships with youth and learn as well as teach/share their knowledge to youth and staff.

Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, strong computer knowledge including, but not limited to excel spreadsheets, strong organizational skills. Exhibit ability to pivot and think in a fast-paced program with multiple personalities and ages. A team player and the ability to multi-task.
