CitySeed is a hybrid work environment with in person and remote meetings and responsibilities. We have a weekly in person team meeting, as well as farmers market events. Work outside of these moments can be completed virtually.

Organization description

CitySeed is a community-based nonprofit with a mission to engage the community in growing an equitable, local food system that promotes economic development, community development and sustainable agriculture. Farmers from around Connecticut bring goods produced from their own local operations to sell at CitySeed's Farmers Markets. The Mobile Market is a market on wheels, bringing fresh produce from Connecticut farms to New Haven neighborhoods and senior sites, along with cooking demonstrations and tastings of local, fresh fruits and vegetables. We source produce from our existing farm network throughout Connecticut and through our main partner in this program, Common Ground High School & Urban Farm, a center for environmental learning and leadership with a working organic farm located in New Haven.

A Yale fellow will assist the farmers market team in developing community programming, tracking SNAP and demographic data, as well as improving our marketing efforts. A Yale fellow will assist with SNAP redemption at farmers markets, as well as complete research on how to improve our local food system within New Haven.

A Yale fellow will assist with SNAP and Senior and WIC Farmers Market Nutrition Program redemption at the farmers markets. The fellow will collect demographic data from persons redeeming these benefits at the market, giving CitySeed more accurate data points on who we are serving. The fellow will complete research on different elements of the New Haven local food system, including farming operations, food businesses, food distribution and donation centers, as well as community organizations, in order to help our organization improve our just food systems plan to better serve all New Haven residents.
