CitySeed is a hybrid work environment with in person and remote meetings and responsibilities. We have a weekly in person team meeting, as well as farmers market events. Work outside of these moments can be completed virtually.

Organization description *(mission statement, population served. 1,000 characters or less)*

CitySeed is a community-based food justice nonprofit with a mission to engage the community in growing an equitable, local food system that promotes economic development, community development and sustainable agriculture. Our organization has three programs: Sanctuary Kitchen, Incubates, and Farmers Markets. Our food entrepreneurship programs, Sanctuary Kitchen and Incubates, focus on supporting under-resourced chefs through affordable kitchen rentals, a Food Business Accelerator, and hands on resources. Our farmers markets host over 30 local farmers each year across the city at 3 locations. Our markets serve as one of the leading redemption sites in the state for nutrition benefits. Our markets team also works to advance policies related to sustainable agriculture and farm viability.

A Yale fellow will assist the farmers market team with administering our SNAP and FMNP doubling programs, as well as leading market programming like children's activities, cooking demonstrations, and community activities. A Yale fellow will also assist our food entrepreneurship programs, assisting our storytelling campaign by documenting the journey of our diverse food entrepreneurs, creating engaging social media content, and coordinating feedback sessions.

Write a more complete description of the specific project you propose and list the duties/outcomes expected of the Fellow.

A Yale fellow will assist with SNAP and Senior and WIC Farmers Market Nutrition Program redemption at the farmers markets. The fellow will collect demographic data from persons redeeming these benefits at the market, giving CitySeed more accurate data points on who we are serving. The fellow will complete research on different elements of the New Haven local food system, including farming operations, food businesses, food distribution and donation centers, as well as community organizations, in order to help our organization improve our just food systems plan to better serve all New Haven residents.

As the Yale fellow will work across several CitySeed programs, the fellow will also have the opportunity to work with our food entrepreneurship programs, working across storytelling, social media, gathering community insights, and synthesizing data to help shape the future of CitySeed Incubates.

-Storytelling & Photography: Capture photos, videos, and interviews with Incubates members to document their experiences and business growth. Craft engaging stories for social media and our outreach materials.

-Social Media Content & Engagement: Create and post stories, reels, and photos on Instagram and Facebook. Track engagement to understand what resonates with our audience and refine storytelling approaches.

-Community Feedback Coordination: Organize and facilitate focus groups with Incubates participants to gather feedback on the new 18,000 sq. ft. food incubator. Summarize findings to inform the incubator's design and program offerings.

-Data Synthesis: Combine feedback, social media engagement, and storytelling results into actionable insights. Summarize patterns, community needs, and trends that will shape future storytelling and programming.

List any specific skills/experience required for the project

Fellows should be social and comfortable speaking with people at events. No prior farmers market experience is required. Fellows should have experience working with people of all backgrounds and socioeconomic status. Prior social media or video and photography experience is welcomed but not required.
