With a mission to inspire independence for those affected by homelessness and housing insecurity, New Reach has been a key community resource for over 30 years. The organization supports over 5,000 individuals each year through a holistic approach, offering housing, advocacy, and tailored services that empower clients to rebuild their lives and achieve sustainable independence.

- 3. Project Management and Organizational Skills
- ♦ Ability to manage multiple tasks and meet deadlines efficiently.
- ♦ Strong organizational skills to maintain accurate documentation, follow-ups, and reports for all outreach efforts and fundraising events.
- 4. Event Planning Experience (Preferred)
- ♦ Previous experience in event planning or coordination, especially for nonprofit or fundraising events, would be advantageous.
- 5. Basic Knowledge of Nonprofit Fundraising
- ♦ Understanding of basic fundraising principles, including donor stewardship, community outreach, and corporate sponsorship.
- ♦ Familiarity with fundraising tools or CRM systems (preferred, but not required).
- 6. Interpersonal Skills and Community Engagement
